

EASTER REFLECTION ON LAUGHTER

Have you ever been infected by someone else's laughter? Like COVID laughter can be infectious, but is more helpful than harmful. Karl Rahner sj wrote one Shrove Tuesday:

"A praising of God is what laughter is because it lets a human being be human' Laughter is a praise of God because it lets a human being be a loving person.

Laughter is praise of God because it is a gentle echo of God's laughter, of the laughter that pronounces judgment on all history. God gave us laughter – we should admit this and laugh."

German Philosopher Nietzsche commented: "If you want me to believe in your redeemer, then you've got to look a lot more redeemed". Some who profess themselves to be Christians believe, mistakenly and sadly, there is no place for fun or joy in religion.

In brief, Christians are called to be people of the Resurrection, people who are joyful, and aspire to be life enlargers, ready to spread their joy wherever life takes them. Do you share your laughter?

GOSPEL Luke 24:35-48

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread. They were still talking about this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them. 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes. Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them. 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

Year of Saint Joseph VI

With a Father's Heart (Patris Corde) (6) God told Saint Joseph: "Get up, take the child and his mother" (Matthew 2:13).

The aim of this Apostolic Letter is to encourage us to implore his intercession and to increase our love for this great saint, to imitate his virtues and his zeal.

Indeed, the proper mission of the saints is not only to obtain miracles and graces, but to intercede for us before God, like Abraham and Moses, and like Jesus, the "one mediator" (1 Timothy 2:5), who is our "advocate" with the Father (1 John 2:1) and who "always lives to make intercession for [us]" (Hebrews 7:25; cf. Romans 8:34).

The saints help all the faithful to strive for the holiness and the perfection of their particular state of life. Their lives are concrete proof that it is possible to put the Gospel into practice.

Jesus told us: "Learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart" (Matthew 11:29). The lives of the saints too are examples to be imitated. Saint Paul explicitly says this: "Be imitators of me!" (1 Corinthians 4:16). By his eloquent silence, Saint Joseph says the same.

Before the example of so many holy men and women, Saint Augustine asked himself: "What they could do, can you not also do?" And so he drew closer to his definitive conversion, when he could exclaim: "Late have I loved you, Beauty ever ancient, ever new!"

We need only ask Saint Joseph for the grace of graces: our conversion.
