

REFLECTION ON THE 2nd SUNDAY OF LENT -Mary Fermio rsj

One of my favourite retreat places was Tarrawarra Abbey, Yarra Glen. There, during these quiet times, God was very present and I experienced some "close encounters" of the spiritual kind. At the end of the retreat, my director would say: Well Mary, time to go down the mountain to the ordinary world. How true!

The Transfiguration was, for Jesus, an encounter with God of a deep spiritual kind, one also shared by the three disciples. The light, the voice from heaven, the presence of Moses and Elijah, would have been a deep experience for Jesus, and such a beautiful encounter, that the apostles wanted to stay there.

But the reality of our humanity demands that we move from such moments back to the dailiness of life. They could not stay on the mountain forever and the ordinariness of life hits them when they return below, to the disciples arguing about healing a young man. Jesus has to step in, take charge, and back to normality.

God is present each day, in our prayer, in each event, each person we encounter, but we also encounter the nitty-gritty of life. Lent is a good time to reflect on this.

ENTRANCE PROCESSION

Of you my heart has spoken: Seek his face. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek; hide not your face from me.

FIRST READING Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Why do we cover crucifixes and Statues during Lent?

It seems strange that during the most sacred time of year we cover all the beautiful images in our churches, even the crucifix. Shouldn't we be looking at the painful scene at Calvary while we listen to the Passion narrative on Palm Sunday?

While it may appear counterintuitive to veil statues and images during the final weeks of Lent, the Church recommends this practice to heighten our senses and build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. It is a tradition that should not only be carried out in our local parish, but can also be a fruitful activity for the "domestic church" to practice.

Usually crosses and images are veiled throughout the church from the fifth Sunday of Lent. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

The statue of St Joseph, if outside the sanctuary, may remain uncovered during the month of March, when his feast occurs and he is specially honoured.

This is the current practice of the Church, but veiling from the Fifth Sunday of Lent onward is minuscule compared with what was once practised. For example, in Germany there was a tradition to veil the altar from view throughout all of Lent. This cloth, known as the "Hungertuch" (hunger cloth), hid the altar from the view of the people until the reading of the Passion on Wednesday of Holy Week at the words "the veil of the temple was rent in two".

The veil in the temple of Jerusalem separated the Holy of Holies from the main body of the temple.

Families are also encouraged to imitate this practice and veil prominent religious images in their homes. It helps us to participate in the liturgical season, especially if we are prevented from going to Mass during the week. Otherwise we only see the veiled images in church once or twice before Easter and it has a minor effect on us. It is also a beautiful tradition to pass down to our children, who will be intrigued by it

and it will make this time of year truly special for them.

But why cover up images that are designed to raise our hearts and minds toward heaven?

First of all, we use veils to alert us of the special time that we are in. When we walk into church and notice everything is covered, we immediately know that something is different. These last two weeks of Lent are meant to be a time of immediate preparation for the Sacred Triduum and these veils are a forceful reminder to get ready.

Second, the veils focus our attention on the words being said at Mass. When we listen to the Passion narrative, our senses are allowed to focus on the striking words from the Gospel and truly enter into the scene.

Third, the Church uses veils to produce a heightened sense of anticipation for Easter Sunday. This is further actualised when you attend daily Mass and see the veils each day.

Further, the veils are not meant to be there forever. The images need to be unveiled; it is unnatural for them to be covered.

The great 19th-century Benedictine liturgist Dom Prosper Gueranger gives a mystical interpretation of the veiling, based on the Gospel of St John, which was formerly read on Passion Sunday.

Just as Jesus hid himself from the Jews who wanted to stone him (cf. John 8:59), so by the veils he is now hidden from the world in preparation for the mysteries of his passion.

The statues of the saints are covered too since, if the Master himself is covered, so should be his servants.

Another spiritual interpretation of the veiling is based on the fact that in Christ's passion, not only was his divinity obscured but so was, in a certain sense, his humanity. He was so disfigured by the blows and scourges that he was hardly recognisable as a man.

The unveiling before the Easter Vigil is a great reminder of our own life on earth. We live in a "veiled" world, in exile from our true home. It is only through our own death that the veil is lifted and we are finally able to see the beauty of everything in our lives.
